6. Report from Police on any matters of local concern and /or interest to Councillors and residents. (See item 16 -Speeding.) PCSO Madden reported that the temporary electronic speeding sign outside the school can continue for short while but asked if the council have any long term plans? Cllr J Airey had stated at the last meeting that he knew of somebody who could come up with a plan for the area and had intended to forward the details to the clerk.

The police are happy to continue for time but don't want to stop and then have things return to normal. The yellow lines are painted as small as possible so as not to 'urbanise' the area. GJ commented that every school in Scotland has 20 mph flashing signs which operate when schools starts and ends. JW stated that in Little Urswick when very few cars are parked there can be a problem. DW agreed that the area just before the Derby is a challenge. Cllr J Willis commented that all the way down this road is a problem which was remarked upon by the public when she was canvassing in the village.

Fortunately there have been no accidents. A flashing sign would cost about £5000. Could funding be found elsewhere?

The Council agreed to continue with the sign for 6 weeks and to ask J Airey to attend next council meeting.

(See No 12 – Cold Calling) PCSO Madden has spoken to Katherine Crowe from Trading Standards. The initial plan was to start sending letters out in Little Urswick but it was decided that as traders would have to drive through Great Urswick to reach it would be safer to include both villages. There will now be a delay of a month and then letters can go out to both villages.

Low Furness School cycle training has now been taken over by police to save the school some money.

7. Reports from District and County Councillors on matters of interest to Councillors and residents.

Cllr J Willis reported that regarding the potholes in the roads, they have been marked for repair. Unfortunately the engineer dislocated shoulder before he could do the work. GJ asked about repairing damaged railings. Cllr Willis said there had been no undertaking to repair railings. GJ replied that there had been an undertaking made at the Local Area Meeting.

Regarding the Village Design statement - £1000 has been ring fenced but the project had been put on hold. This is an extension to parish plan to decide what village should look like including types of streetlights etc keep our own village identity.

Cllr J Cooper had arranged for some dropped kerbs to be put in place. It was commented that the dropped kerb opposite the recreation ground is of very poor quality. Cllr Willis to chase & liaise with NC re village design statement.

Cllr C Airey stated that as she had been elected less than a week ago she had nothing to report as yet.

9. Tarn Association. Report on anything of concern and/or interest to Councillors and residents in particular.

Martin Stables reported that the AGM was held on Tuesday and was very poorly attended, he is still chairman, but there was nothing of note to report.

GJ commented that a lady had attended on behalf of Mr & Mrs Davis who suffered from flooding in Church View and asked if the District Councillor could assist in matter of getting beck cleaned out regularly. Mr Stables commented that this was nothing to do with the level of the tarn and that if the level drops too much there would be nothing in the reed bed. He added that the house concerned is subsiding with brick vents at water line. He has connected the Environment Agency who police this and has left a message. The water does come up periodically but this isn't the problem. GJ asked to be notified when Mr Stables has spoken to the officer concerned.

GJ reported that he had had a look at it and noted that it isn't very different to any other verge at the moment. NC pointed out that brambles grow out during the summer, which would be an issue for the highways steward.

Planning application received 11<sup>th</sup> May 2010 (SL/2010/0182) SLDC have agreed to extend the consultation period extended until 22<sup>nd</sup> July, the application will then be considered by the Planning Committee on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

GJ stated that council opposed to the application which has altered since we first heard about it. The plan is to hold a public meeting to show plans and to collect responses from parishioners. He emphasised that individual letters carry more weight than a petition. In the week commencing 31<sup>st</sup> May we will have a public meeting and try to formulate a view. In the last 3 planning applications the loss of historic view, loss of employment and changing nature of the village were all considered

In the 2nd application the Coot conversion was approved & then additionally 3 cottages were applied for and were turned down. Change of use is needed dependant on how they deal with moving employment from the Coot to Bankfield House.

The development is worth a lot of money and perhaps SLDC should be asked to put bond of 1 million pounds on the project to make sure the whole thing is carried out

A private meeting will be held to organise public meeting which will then be advertised around the villages.

SLDC guidelines on objecting to planning application will be put on website and handed out at meeting.

It was suggested from the floor that as this is a fundamental change to Urswick , could a cooperative in village be formed to buy part of site?

Martin Stables stated that this has been mooted previously but was a non starter. It was stated that the proposed housing was unlikely to come within the remit of 'affordable housing'

It should be borne in mind that planning has been granted for footprint of existing Coot in the past. **ACTION: ALL**
